

Born in Florida, Connie spent 25 years in the heart of Music City—Nashville, Tennessee—honing her gifts as a singer/songwriter. She originally moved to Nashville chasing country music dreams, but in 1992 everything changed when she met her Savior. From that moment, her talent turned toward writing and ministering for God. Connie became a beloved Christian TV and Radio host, directed Christian Songwriter Nights and a National Christian Songwriters Contest. Served as production assistant for the very first Christian Country Music Awards, and performed/presented at the ICGMA Awards. She even took home Song of the Year for her powerful track “Quiet Time” from the Country News Awards.

In the late '90s, Connie had the incredible honor of assembling and directing the Now More Than Ever Children’s Choir, which opened a concert for none other than Celine Dion. She appeared in TV commercials and specials alongside Reba McEntire and a young Taylor Swift, and for five years sang choir backup at the legendary Grand Ole Opry during Sunday Morning Country—sharing the stage with Hee Haw and Opry icons.

Connie gave back generously, volunteering with the Liver Foundation alongside Naomi Judd and the Leukemia Society with Billy Ray Cyrus. She spent countless hours sharing her testimony of faith in churches and organizations across the Southeast.

Life hasn’t always been easy. Connie has faced life-threatening challenges, more than 20 surgeries, and heartbreaking losses—her mom, dad, sister, and both brothers. After a painful divorce left her feeling alone, she returned home to Florida.

Settling in Titusville, Connie poured her heart into ministering and singing at churches, women’s groups, and senior communities. In January 2024, she began volunteering at WPIO 89.3 FM during Shar-a-thon, and by June she was offered her very own show.

2026 marks a beautiful new season in Connie’s life. In February 2026, Connie left Florida and headed west to Jennings, Louisiana. She joins the ministry team at HLE Radio as a Host of Kickin It Up with Connie. Through this new role, she will be sharing the Gospel, playing traditional Christian Country music, and encouraging hearts across the airwaves throughout the world.

Connie will also be ministering and helping build strong, Christ-centered community throughout the HLE Radio network. We are grateful for God’s guidance in this next chapter and excited to see how He will use her voice, faith, and love for His people.
